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## OVERVIEW

The **IPENZ Transportation Group's Annual Conference** is New Zealand's premier forum for the traffic engineering, road safety and transportation planning community. It is intended to stimulate debate and collaboration amongst peers. Around 200 professionals attend the annual event, which has been running for over 30 years.

Transportation professionals are increasingly called upon to resolve complex and often conflicting issues of road safety, traffic engineering, sustainability, accessibility and land use planning, to name but a few. The best solutions to these issues often come from interaction and collaboration between professionals, which provides continued learning and improvement for both individuals and the industry as a whole. The Transportation Conference is an ideal forum to facilitate such interaction, allowing us to solve issues together.

'2010 and Beyond' aims to expand on the early workshop and conference format, and now encourages remits, technical notes and technical papers to be presented throughout the 3-day event.

There will be plenty of opportunity for discussion after presentations.

Submissions are invited on the following major themes:

1. **Travel and Transport Demand Management**
2. **Strategy Development and Meeting Targets**
3. **Traffic Management and Intelligent Transport Solutions**
4. **Road Safety - Design, Implementation and Monitoring**
5. **Land Use and Transportation Planning**

## Remit

The purpose of the Remit is to present ideas and may be as simple as presenting the scope for research projects.

Typical length – 1 page

## Technical Note

The purpose of the Technical Note is to expand on the remit and provide sound justification for the idea/application being presented, and could include practical applications. These papers must be refereed to ensure good practice.

Typical length – 5 pages

## Conference Paper

The purpose of the Conference Paper and presentations is to provide in-depth and detailed analysis of the topic. It is intended to be much more theory based. These papers must be refereed to ensure good practice and should focus on new applications, planning, strategies etc.

Typical length - 10-15 pages.



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## Abstracts

Abstracts will be reviewed for consistency with Conference topics and commonality. However, please note that remits and papers are not limited to any of the particular themes developed around the Conference. All submissions will be welcomed and the committee will determine streaming as part of the programming. The organising committee will then confirm to authors if their proposed Abstract is accepted. Remits should be tailored to fit a 10 minute time slot (including time for discussion - say 5 minutes for presentation and 5 minutes for discussion). Should a longer presentation be planned, please indicate this in your remit - where possible, we will endeavour to accommodate this.

The organising committee plans to publish a Conference Handbook and distribute this to attendees in advance of the Conference. Authors are welcome to follow-up their remit with a presentation 'paper', although this is not a requirement of the Conference. Where presentation 'papers' are received beforehand, they too will be published in the Conference Handbook.

The Conference media facilities will include over-head projection, display boards, and PowerPoint Projection (the preferred medium for visual presentation).

## Categorising Papers and Awards

To streamline the awards to compare apples with apples, and also with a view to categorising the remits, categorising projects for the study award and assisting in refining the entire conference format, the following categories are suggested:

1. Transport Systems Design and Technology
2. Transport Planning, Strategies, Policy, and Community Planning
3. Transport Usage, Safety, Human Behaviour

Awards will be given for the best paper in each category (not including technical notes), with the NZAA Award to be given for the best overall paper.
