<p>Your NZTPDB Inc. is now successfully operating as a self funding cooperative with nearly 50 members. drawn from 4 Regional Councils, 14 City councils, 8 district Councils, 20 consultancies</p> <p>With this horsepower behind us and an excellent Board, in 2005/2006 we set up the WEBSITE <a href="http://www.nztpdb.org.nz">www.nztpdb.org.nz</a> and also gained agreement with our UK counterpart TRICS to have access to their database for our NZ members. NZTPDB also has a significant LTNZ research project to 'correlate the trip making and parking demands of major groups of land use in NZ and UK'. during 2006/2007.</p> <p>DOUBLING THE DATA BASE this year is our intention. This involves adding new trip and parking information for a wider variety of land uses, including more mode split information. To do this we need more members and application forms are available at the display desk.</p> <p>WE ALSO NEED MORE SURVEY RESULTS This means all members are asked to send in any surveys ( on the appropriate forms) any reports or any evidences covering trips and parking surveys to share with other members.</p> <p>TO ESTABLISH GOOD PRACTICE IN SURVEYS AND EVIDENCE we are running a series of 1 day workshops around NZ in March 2007. This will enable professionals, engineers and planners to exchange information and agree best practice.</p> <p>ARE YOU SATIFIED with the quality of survey information being reported and the standards being met in District Plans, evidences and reports. Do you need support to convince your council or client of the appropriate values they should be using in their plans and standards ?. There is a need for consistency across the country. This is where the NZTPDB is an economic way for memebtrs to develop data so as to establish standards and best practice.</p> <p>RECOMMENDATION to all councils and consultants during 2006/2007</p> <ol style="list-style-type: none"> <li>Send engineers and planners to the March workshops.
